Dear Parents,

Thank you for your continued patience and support during the most recent Coronavirus outbreak. With the current restrictions expected to continue for an extended period it is important that we work together to ensure the best outcomes for our students. At the time of printing all of NSW is under stay-at-home orders. This means that parents and carers across all regional NSW and Greater Sydney must keep children – across primary and secondary school – at home unless they need to be at school. This places us in **Level 4 restrictions**.

This guide has been created to give parents and students a clear understanding of the processes, expectations and supports available to our students and families while our school is subject to stay-at-home orders.

Current stay-at-home orders are in place until the 10th of September. There is a high chance that these orders will be further extended. The NSW Government has announced a plan for a staged return to face-to-face learning in NSW. This plan is subject to change if current stay-at-home orders are lifted.

Planned dates for return to face-to-face learning:

- Monday 25th October (Week 4, Term 4) Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 12 will return to school
- Monday 1st November (Week 5, Term 4) Year 2, Year 6 and Year 11 will return to school
- Monday 8th November (Week 6, Term 4) all remaining students will return to school

Factors that impact these dates are:

- If stay-at-home orders are lifted prior to the dates above students will return to face to face teaching.
- All students will return to school at **Level 3 restrictions.** Level 3 restrictions require: masks worn by students in Year 7 and over and by staff inside and outside of buildings. There can be no gatherings, choir, assemblies, or visitors to the school. Students must remain in year or stage groups.
- If our Local Government Area remains an "area of concern" on the staged return to school date 25th October school will not return.

What does this mean for our students?

- Students at KHS will continue to learn from home until the planned return dates.
- Our school will remain open for students who cannot be educated at home.
- Upon return students are required to wear a mask at all times, unless eating or drinking.

Wearing Masks at School:

From Monday 30 August, students in schools subject to stay-at-home rules in Year 7 and above will be required to wear face masks in both indoor and outdoor settings while on school grounds.

This is to align with the NSW Health Public Health Order, which requires all persons over the age of 12 living in areas subject to stay-at-home rules to wear a face mask in public indoor venues and while outdoors. The new requirement will also help support the health and safety of students and staff attending school.

In summary, masks or face coverings are required for schools subject to stay-at-home rules in:

- all indoor and outdoor settings for all staff
- all indoor and outdoor settings for students in Year 7 and above. •

Teachers and students are expected to supply their own masks where possible. This aligns with the Public Health Order requirement for all persons over the age of 12 to carry a face mask with them whenever they leave their home. There will be masks available for those who require them.

Accessing work:

All student work is accessible via one of two online platforms: Microsoft Teams or Google Classrooms. Instructions for accessing these platforms are attached to the back of this guide.

Teachers have emailed students instructions on how to access their work each week. Students in Years 7 to10 are expected to communicate with each of their teachers at least once a week. If students do not have internet access this can be done via return of work to the school office. Students in Year 11 and Year 12 should be communicating with their teachers during or after each scheduled lesson.

Students who do not have reliable internet or are unable to print required work at home may request printed copies of work by contacting the school office between 9am and 3pm Monday to Friday on 02 6379 4103. Printed work will be available for collection from the school office after 12pm on Tuesdays. If work cannot be collected on Tuesdays, please contact the school to arrange postage or delivery.

Completing and returning work:

Students are expected to return work at least once a week. Each teacher will indicate to students in their class how they would like work returned. This will be via completing work online and uploading to the online platform (Microsoft Teams or Google Classroom) or filling in hard copies and returning them to the school.

To return hard copies, please use the contact free drop box outside the school office. This is a grey filing cabinet next to the school entry. Work placed in here will be cleared daily and forwarded to students' teachers at the earliest possible convenience. Please make sure that the student name, class and teachers name are on the front of any documents returned to help our staff.

Expected workload of students:

Students in Stage 4 (Year 7 and 8) and Stage 5 (Year 9 and 10) will be following a modified timetable in line with the NSW Department of Education (DET) Guidelines for learning from home. This timetable has been emailed to students and a hard copy can be printed on request. Students in Year 11 and 12 will follow their usual timetable.

A Year Meeting for all students & their Year Advisor will be made during the allocated time. Students will be emailed an invite to this meeting.

Stage 6 Students (Year 11 and Year 12)

Students in Stage 6 will continue to follow their regular timetable. Students are expected to maintain regular contact with their teachers. Teachers will be available to connect with students during regular lesson times and will be contacting students if they are not making regular contact or submitting work on time.

Key Changes to HSC Exams and Dates:

- The HSC will now commence on the 9th of November.
- Social distancing measures will be in place.
- Students should check with their class teachers for subject specific date changes.
- A revised HSC timetable will be available soon.

Year 12 Trial HSC Exams and Reports:

- Exams that were not able to be completed in the exam period have been cancelled and an estimated mark will be given based on previous assessments.
- Teachers are preparing Year 12 reports, and these will be available early next term.

Year 11 Yearly Exams and Reports:

- Year 11 exams have been cancelled.
- Students will receive an estimated mark based on previous assessments from this year.
- Teachers are preparing reports, and these will be available early next term.

Student and Parent Support

Learning from home isn't easy. Many students are going to struggle to complete work without help. Other students may struggle with the isolation of learning from home. Our school has many specialist staff who are dedicated to helping your child through this difficult time.

Year Advisers

Your child's Year Adviser is the first point of contact if they are having minor issues. Year Advisers will be holding weekly catch up meetings online and will be phoning to check in with students who don't have internet access. Year advisers can be contacted via email or requesting a call back through the school office on 02 6379 4103. It would be great if all students could connect for these meetings as often as possible as they are a way of maintaining some social connections.

Join a class as a student

This article is for students

To use Classroom, you need to sign in on your computer or mobile device and then join classes. Then, you can get work from your teacher and communicate with your classmates. When you join a class on one device, you're enrolled in that class on all devices.

1. How to join a class

You have 2 ways to join a class:

- Join a class with a class code—If your teacher gives you a class code, use this code to add yourself to the class. Your teacher might give you the code while you're in class or email it to you.
- Accept an invitation from your teacher—If your teacher sends you an invitation, you'll see Join on the class card on your Classroom homepage.

2. Forgot or lost the class code? Code won't work?

If you deleted, lost, or forgot the class code before joining a class, ask your teacher to resend the code or set a new one. If the code isn't working, ask your teacher for help.

Note: You only use the class code once to join the class. You are then enrolled in the class, and you don't need to re-use the code again.

Join a class with a class code

- 1. Go to https://classroom.google.com.
- 2. At the top, click Add + > **Join** class.
- Enter the class code your teacher gave you and click Join. A class code consists of 6 or 7 letters or numbers. For example, hjhmgrk or g5gdp1.

- 1. Go to https://classroom.google.com.
- 2. On the class card, click Join.
