Year 10 - Mock Interviews

This term Year 10 Work Education is aimed at preparing them for the world of work. The course assessment task requires students to reflect on themselves, their interests and experiences, their preferences in the workplace and the skills and knowledge that they have developed thus far. The culmination of this process will be "Mock Interviews" conducted by selected members of the local business community and Kandos High School staff.

Students will be required to dress appropriately for the interview – they will not be permitted to wear jeans, joggers, skate shoes or other casual attire. Boys must have a collared shirt preferably with a tie, as a minimum standard. Girls are asked NOT to wear brief skirts/dresses or low cut tops, excessive jewellery or makeup. Whilst students can share their "interview outfits", this is a good opportunity for students to practise for a real interview situation in a non-threatening environment, therefore, collection of these items from family, friends, charity shops etc, to create their own individual package is encouraged.
