

#### YOUTH MOTO WORKSHOP IN KANDOS

Mudgee PCYC is excited to announce that it will soon be offering Youth Moto Workshops in Kandos.

This initiative aims to provide local youth with practical skills and experience in the area of motorcycle mechanics, hopefully assisting in future long-term employment for the target market.

Mudgee PCYC - Youth Moto Workshop will operate on a weekly basis, during which members will participate in the restoration, repair and maintenance of club owned motorcycles. Members will also be given the opportunity to work on their own private motorcycles, with full access to club facilities and expertise.

For those wishing to become a volunteer please note that you must have a current working with children check (this is free and easy to obtain) and you will also need to undergo a police check to assess your suitability. Volunteers will also need to become members of Mudgee PCYC which incurs a fee of \$20. Application forms and instructions on how to become a member of PCYC are available at the office of your school.

Similarly any students who wish to become involved in the workshops will need to become members of Mudgee PCYC. A fee of \$10 applies and application forms can be obtained at the school office.

If you do not wish to, or are unable to volunteer, but wish to assist by way of a donation, or if you have an old, run-down motorcycle which you wish to donate to the club please contact Mudgee PCYC. Any donation over \$2 is tax deductible and will go a long way to supporting your local community.
