

YEAR 9 CAMP

On Wednesday the 11th October, 27 Year 9 students travelled to the central coast to begin their three day camp at the Great Aussie Bush Camp at their Tea Gardens site. Students were accompanied by Year Adviser Julie Parsons, PD/H/PE teacher Brad Stockwell, and SLSO Leigh-Anne Thorn.

Students undertook at variety of activities designed to challenge them and move them out of their comfort zone and also to build trust in each other and encourage them to work together as a team. The students willingly undertook the challenges put before them, beginning their program with the High Ropes course. One student, coming to the end of the course, made the comment- "I don't know why I was frightened, you have to do this".

After lunch back at the camp, the group were involved in a session on Rock and Water which encouraged students to look at positive ways to handle conflict and build relationships. After dinner on the first night we completed the Giant Swing, which required all to work together as a team. It was a great experience, as teachers and students alike hoisted each other up and also trusted others with their safety.

After breakfast on day two, the group was taken to Jerry's Beach where they undertook games and activities on the beach and also had the opportunity to swim. It was a great morning and everyone enjoyed the morning's activities. After lunch, the group completed the Lost Island challenge, basically a mud-run. It was great fun and the participants thoroughly enjoyed the experience, despite the layers of mud and physical challenges it presented.

Later in the afternoon there were more Rock and Water team activities and watching twenty-seven students trying to swing on a rope and land on pallets and fit the entire group on without anyone falling off was very interesting to say the least. That night the group was involved in a Challenge evening which included physical challenges, trivia and games, it was a great way to cap off a very full but enjoyable day.

Friday saw us begin the day with a Vertical Challenge, which again tested our trust in others as our team's belayed individuals up and down a number of extremely challenging vertical obstacles.

At the debrief at the end of the program students overwhelmingly expressed their satisfaction with the camp, the activities they had undertook, the fun they had experienced and just what a wonderful time they had had overall. After lunch we travelled home in an uneventful but pleasant trip.

Special thanks must go to or driver Mick from Mt Panorama coaches, he was fantastic.

I would like to congratulate each and every student on their behaviour and participation. I would also like to extend my personal thanks to Mr Stockwell and Mrs Thorn for their willingness to attend and participate. - More subjects and teachers,
- Responsibility of getting to classes in different rooms on time,
- The need to manage their learning and equipment,
- Carrying books between classes,
- Adapting to different learning styles,
- No 'home' classroom.

With the help of family and school staff, students usually adapt quickly to their new environment.

On Friday 20th October, students in Year 7-10 were treated to a presentation by indigenous story teller Larry Brandy. Larry is a Wiradjuri man from Condobolin in central New South Wales. Larry's interactive story telling style brought to life how Wiradjuri people used to hunt and find food.

He used real Aboriginal artefacts as well as animal masks to encourage participation. Larry involved students in stories that he told by getting them to act various parts, this was extremely engaging. He also taught the students about the artefacts he brought along, how they were made, by whom, how they were used and so on. Larry incorporated Wiradjuri language in his presentation, teaching the students Wiradjuri words for many of the artefacts and in the stories. It was a fabulous presentation and well received by our staff and students.

School travel update

Application information - June 2017

Information for parents, guardians and students

Our school has partnered with Transport for NSW to use the new online School Portal for endorsing school travel applications and submitting School Drive Subsidy and Private Vehicle Conveyance Scheme attendance checks.

You are now able to manage all your school travel needs online including applying for school travel passes, tracking the status of your application and tracking the status of your School Drive Subsidy application and payments.

The application process has also been simplified so that a new or updated application for school travel passes is only needed when a student is:

- applying for a school travel pass for the first time
- requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).
- changing school or campus
- · changing home address
- receiving an expiry notification
- · repeating a school year
- changing their name
- requesting a new transport operator.

This means students who are progressing to year 3 and year 7 only need to reapply if they are changing circumstances.

Students who are not residents and are temporarily in Australia can also provide their visa subclass number or exchange program when applying online, making the application and approval process much faster.

Note: Student attendance checks will be available for completion by schools after the last day of semester (1 July 2017).



THE SAFER DRIVERS COURSE INVOLVES TWO MODULES: MODULE ONE:
