
## **SENSORY GARDEN**



## REMEMBRANCE DAY

Once again, this year we marked this event with a whole-school service. Staff would like to acknowledge and thank the student body for the respect and maturity they showed during this service. A number of students presented information some of the history and symbols significant to Remembrance Day along with poems and music of import to this day.

This year we had two focuses for our service. Australian Peacekeepers and The Unknown Soldiers.

2017 marks the 70th anniversary of Australian Peacekeeping.

There has not been a year since 1947 when Australian Peacekeepers were not in the field, yet this aspect of our country's military history is often overshadowed by Australia's fascination with its wartime past.

Peacekeepers traditionally serve in countries destroyed by war. Among their many duties they treat casualties, help with and make possible the distribution of human aid, stand between hostile armies and report when one or the other opposing armies fail to follow commands in situations where a ceasefire has been declared. They have overseen elections – sometimes in the most dangerous of circumstances, they have cleared and taught locals how to clear land mines, and provided medical, communications and movement control teams. Seven Australians have commanded international peacekeeping operations.

Wars during the 20th Century have resulted in millions of unknown dead resting in unknown graves. Of Australia's war dead from World War I and World War II, over 35 thousand, or about 35 percent, have no identified grave. They are commemorated on Memorials to the Missing.

In 1993 a tomb dedicated to The Unknown Soldier by the then Prime Minister Mr Paul Keating was interred in the Hall of Remembrance. During our service Daniel Chadwick ably read an extract of the eulogy that was presented at this dedication. A part of that extract appears below.

We do not know this Australian's name and we never will. We do not know his rank or his battalion. We do not know where he was born, nor precisely how and when he died. We do not know where in Australia he had made his home or when he left it for the battlefields of Europe. We do not know his age or his circumstances – whether he was from the city or the bush; what occupation he left to become a soldier; what religion, if he had a religion; if he was married or single. We do not know who loved him or whom he loved. If he had children we do not know who they are. His family is lost to us as he was lost to them. We will never know who this Australian was. He is all of them. And he is one of us.

The student leaders who presented all the items at our service did so with composure, maturity and the highest level of respect. Thank you.




## **PBL - POSITIVE RELATIONSHIPS**
