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REMEMBRANCE DAY 2018

Kandos High School commemorated the 100th anniversary of Remembrance Day on November 12, with the playground coming to an abrupt silence for one minute, in a mark of respect for fallen soldiers from around the world. Kandos RSL sub-branch member, Mr Glen Evans, who served during the Vietnam War as a Sapper with the Royal Australian Engineers between 1969 - 1970, introduced the proceedings with a reading of a speech declaring victory and the armistice. He then requested the minute's silence which the students and staff dutifully complied with.

Mr Evans also brought his mates, Mr Ken Bevitt and Mr Allan Herbert. Mr Bevitt served as a Corporal (Temporary) with the Royal Australian Engineers between 1969 - 1970, while Mr Herbert served from 1967 - 1971 with 1 Australian Reinforcement Unit, 6th Battalion RAR, 7th Battalion RAR and 2nd Battalion RAR.

In the service that followed, KHS students spoke about the reactions of jubilation in towns and cities across Australia and the world upon the declaration of peace on 11 November, 1918. As well, the strange, sombre reality for the service personnel abroad as they looked around at the devastation, many in no mood to celebrate.

Mr Evans also presented the school with a banner made of poppies, proudly knitted by himself and his wife, Rose, as well as a host of other local women. They also presented the school with a wire cross adorned with a knitted poppy, dedicated to Norman Ford - a Kandos man who served during World War 1.

We would like to thank Mr and Mrs Evans for these beautiful keepsakes which will take pride of place at the school's future ANZAC Day and Remembrance Day services. We would also like to thank Mr Bevitt and Mr Herbert for their attendance.

HSC MINIMUM STANDARD TESTS

Students will need to meet a minimum standard of literacy and numeracy to receive their Higher School Certificate in or after 2020. They must demonstrate that they can meet a HSC Minimum Standard by passing three HSC Minimum Standard tests.

The tests consist of three components:

- * Minimum Standard Reading Test 45 multiple choice questions
- * Minimum Standard Numeracy Test 45 multiple choice questions
- * Minimum Standard Writing Test one question based on a visual or text prompt with up to a 500 word response.

The test dates for Kandos High School are:

- * Tuesday 27 November 2018 Reading and Writing
- * Friday 30 November 2018 Numeracy

Sample test questions are available for students to familiarise themselves with what to expect from the test and to practise if they wish. These are available at the webpage shown below:

CLAIM THE DATE


The 2018 privilege excursion will be held on Friday 14 December.

STUDY SKILLS HANDBOOK FOR NOVEMBER: PREPARING FOR SENIOR STUDIES

As many senior students prepare to leave school at the end of this year and embark on further education or a new career, a whole batch of students are preparing to join the ranks of the senior students next year.

As students approach the senior years, they are expected to start taking more responsibility for their own learning. For many students part of this is a realisation that they need to do their schoolwork for their own sake, to keep options open for their own future – so they start to work for themselves, not just because their teacher or parent says they have to. Other students come to realize that in order to cope with the increased workload in the senior years, they need to work more efficiently at home and in the classroom, small changes like changing who students sit next to can make a big difference to how much work is completed in class.

So for students who are commencing their senior studies next year, the final term this year is important in taking stock of your approach to school and your studies. Do you work well in the classroom? Who do you sit next to? What are your listening and research skills like? Do you have systems in place to manage your homework and assignments? Do you know how to study effectively and have you tried different study techniques?

It seems many students think they will wake up Day 1 of their senior studies and suddenly have become a 'super student' overnight. This does not happen! Habits take at least a month to change – sometimes longer if they are deeply ingrained.

So for those students commencing their senior studies next year, use the last weeks of school this year to:

- Reflect on how you approach your studies. What do you do well, and what do you need to work on changing? Perhaps choose the top 5 areas to work on and write these on a card and place it somewhere at home where you will see it regularly and be reminded.
- Complete as many units as you can of www.studyskillshandbook.com.au. This site can help you work out where your areas of weakness are and teach you new skills to try in these areas. In particular, 'Becoming a Senior Student'. There is a great quiz in this unit that helps you see how ready you are for senior studies This is also a great way to work out where your areas of weakness lie.
