PHASE 1: MANAGED RETURN TO STUDENTS

There is a planned phased return of students from next Monday, 11th May, 2020. Phase 1 allows students to return and be attending school at least 1 day per week, however this is not compulsory. Parents are encouraged to keep their children home, except for their designated day (unless the parents are essential service workers or the family is vulnerable). There are three options available during this return, outlined further below:

- 1. Essential services students attend daily.
- 2. Students attend school one day per week on their designated day and continue remote learning for the remaining days unless otherwise specified.
- 3. Parents still have the option of keeping your child at home and continuing with online learning. Please notify the school clearly stating your child's name and year group if you intend them not to return.

Please find an overview summary on the following page and more specific information as below:

- The school canteen will re-commence operations in week 3 with a limited menu, until the student population return to normal.
- Staff are still working on a flexible roster from home two days per week.
- Wednesday is a scheduled planning day for staff to manage the additional workflow required for remote learning. Students will continue with independent learning, classrooms for essential service students and Banksia students will be supervised on this day.
- Classes may be divided to adhere to social distancing measures of 10-15 students per learning space.
- Students will remain in the same learning space for the duration of the day.
- During the on-site lessons, students continue with their online lessons or learning packages. Staff will check in with students on work completed at home and provide guidance and advice in completing work.
- To staff this phased return, students will be following their individual school timetable. For example: Year 7 will follow Monday Week A on 11th May; Year 8 will follow Tuesday Week A on 12th May; etc.
- Year 12 have practical sessions allocated and have the flexibility to attend as needed, a roster will be
 provided for them to check in with teachers. Seniors need to ensure they sign in and out through the
 front office, parental permission should be provided if they are leaving early.
- Please continue to return work either via mail or to the drop box outside the school.
- Work will continue to be mailed to those students who are physically not attending, please ensure the office is aware of these students for term 2.
- At this stage everything additional to the classroom teaching and learning is on hold; excursions, camps, sporting events and assemblies. Any monies already collected have been allocated as fees in advance (credit), against the student, until we are able to make a decision on whether these will proceed later in the year.
- Buses are running as normal. Each day students need to engage in social distancing where possible, especially when lining up and getting on/off buses.
- Parents are asked to avoid gathering near gates and to practice social distancing when transporting students. You are encouraged to call the office prior to attending to ensure we can meet your needs on the day.
- Students and staff have been asked to not attend if they are feeling unwell. Students presenting ill
 throughout the day, will be sent to sick bay and parents will be contacted.
- We have additional cleaning services in place at the school. Sanitizer is available on entry to the front of the school and in classes, we encourage students to use this as part of their daily hygiene practice.
- Students need to be respectful of social distancing and remain 1.5 metres apart and to be courteous of
 others space when using corridors and queuing. Students who do not adhere to these health and safety
 requirements will be reminded of our expectations.

I would like to thank all students and parents for your ongoing support throughout these difficult circumstances. We are looking forward to seeing our students faces in person – we have missed you.

STUDENTS - There are 3 options for schooling in Phase 1

1. Attend school at least **one day per week**. – As per Department of Education advice.

Students

On the day/s you are at school

- Bring all your current school work and assignments and your charged laptop.
- · Check your emails
- Collect / download and print work from your teachers from room 1.
- Follow their school timetable at school and home and complete set work and assessments.
- Return the work and assessments to school into the drop box located at the front of the office labelled appropriately.

Supervising teachers can

- Help you get organised
- Hand out and collect work for all subjects
- Give you access to the computer room to print work or complete work.
- Answer all your questions, or help find someone who can.

NOTE: when returning your work please make sure you **label the following on the front.** This will make it easy for the work to find the right teacher.

2. Attend School Everyday – Essential Workers children and vulnerable students 7-12.

Students will follow the same process as the one day per week students.

3. Student's Parents choose to keep them **home every day**.

Parents must contact the office on 6379 4103 and notify the school of the reason, if you are choosing this option. Otherwise the student will be marked as an unexplained absence.

Students

- Check your emails daily.
- · Read the instructions from your teachers.
- Collect from school / download and print work from your teachers.
- Check in with your Year Adviser everyday via email / video (those with internet).
- Follow your school timetable at home and complete set work and assessments.
- Return the work and assessments to school in a timely manner (at least once per week)
 - Email to your teacher
 - Photograph the work and email to your teacher
 - Return to the front office drop box
 - Out of town students can use the provided KHS envelopes to return their work packaGe to school by placing them into their own mailboxes for pickup/collection by Australia Post



TOP TIPS FOR STAYING FOCUSED IN AN ONLINE LESSON by Dr Prue Salter from

www.enhanced-learning.net

By now we are all starting to get a bit more used to different modes of learning. If you are still finding it challenging to stay focused in online lessons, here are some tips to help you:

- Have clear distinctions between schoolwork time and your personal time. If you let those two worlds collide you will end up never really feeling like you can have time to yourself without feeling guilty. Then in the learning times you can make a more conscious effort to stay on track.
- If you know you can't stay focused in your bedroom, then do your learning in another part of the house where someone can check up on you. Working in an area of the house where you will be supervised can help you stay on track.
- Take notes when you are listening to the teacher talk or make a mind map about what is being discussed in the lesson. If you are writing about what you are learning it will help you to be more focused.
- 4. Turn off all notifications and make sure your mobile is on silent (or preferably in another room). Don't have other windows or applications open on your computer. Take away the temptation so you <u>don't</u> send messages to other students or work on other tasks during a lesson when you are meant to be focused.
- Every 20 minutes look away at something 20 feet (about 6 metres) away for 20 seconds to reduce eye strain. Stand up and stretch if you need to.





While some students and families have embraced remote home learning, others are still struggling with certain aspects. For most schools

Term 2 there will be a mix of some students returning to classes and others learning from home. How long this will continue for and if it will need to be adjusted again, no-one knows at this point in time. Dr Salter (a specialist in study skills) has released a video series answering the most commonly asked FAQs to help Years 7-12 families make the learning taking place at home as effective as possible this term. At a time where many would normally attend dawn services or marches it was inspiring to see mini-services, with driveways lit up by candle light at dawn and front gates and verandas decorated with poppies and rosemary. Lest We Forget.

William James Hamilton Lowe formerly of Crudine NSW. Enlisted in the First World War in August 1915. He was a member of the 12th Light Horse Regiment, 2nd Machine Gun Squadron and was killed in action August 1918 in Jericho, Palestine. He is buried in Jerusalem War Cemetery, Israel.

He is honoured in the Commemorative Area at the Australian War Memorial and is remembered by his family descendants attending KHS.
