Industrial Technology Metals & Engineering

Kandos High School would like to congratulate the Year 12 Industrial Technology Metals & Engineering class of 2023. They have worked consistently in researching, designing, fabricating, and evaluating three exceptional projects.

Cooper Duff fabricated a Meat Smoker from a range of materials that incorporated a cabinet, fire box and smoker. The project was designed by Cooper, and he created a detailed computer aided drawing. The smoker was finished in a black high temperature paint and the cabinet had a silver hammer tone enamel paint finish. that will be transferable to their future career paths.



Ky Reddish fabricated accessories for his car that included a bull bar, bumper bar, and rockslides. The complexity of designing these components and making them fit to his vehicle challenged him throughout the fabrication process. He incorporated spotlights, a winch and a swivel mount on the bumper bar for the spare tyre to move to access the tailgate. Ky completed the project to a high standard which included scallop welded pipe. He finished the project with raptor paint to match the car.



Lukas Farrugia fabricated a five-post Bull Bar that would scare any animal that crosses its path. He made the bar to fit his Nissan Patrol and there was complexity with the setup of jigs and alignment so it would complement his car well. Lukas is commended on his computer aided drawing of his bull bar that was completed to industry standard. He finished the bar in a gun metal grey hammer tone enamel paint.



All three projects demonstrated a high degree of researching, planning and time outside of school hours. Kandos High School would also like to thank R & K Engineering for their support in allowing our students to complete an Industry Study of their company and for assisting our students with use of their equipment and workshop in the fabrication of Major Projects.

All three students can be proud of their achievements and have gained value skills that will be transferable to their future career paths.

He showed the students several of his well-known artworks and the step-by-step process he went through (or didn't) to complete an artwork, focusing on the "crisis" moment every artist feels when trying to finish an artwork; invaluable advice for these students.

Michael then introduced his art concept for Cementa24 to our students; two wooden boards with paint and collages depicting the township of Kandos. Michael invited the students to dig deep into their imaginations and think of unique concepts for how Kandos may look in a different perspective; like how a Surrealist may view Kandos. Students used word maps and word experimentation to aid in developing many interesting drawings of Kandos.

A massive shout out to Michael for visiting our school and enriching our students' art education further! We look forward to seeing your final artwork and thank you for letting us be a part of your interesting Cementa project. Also, a big thank you to Cementa for connecting our school with your visiting artists and with your festival! As a small rural school, we're very honoured and privileged to have this opportunity.



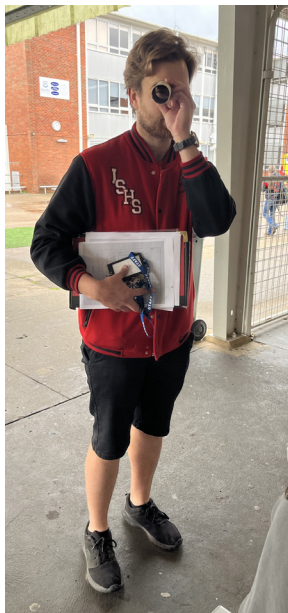
Year 11 Italian Pop Up Restaurant

Off & Away | Gate to Gate

Kandos High School Mobile Phone Policy & Procedure

RATIONALE

Our school has officially launched an "Off and Away" mobile phone policy. The policy extends beyond the classroom to include all areas of the school, encompassing all transition time between classes, in toilets, during Lunch 1 and Lunch 2, during extracurricular activities such as school excursions and camps. The "Off and Away - Gate to Gate" policy means that student mobile phones are not to be seen or used while on school grounds. If students breach the policy, consequences will apply, including confiscation of their device and parent/carer contact (see overleaf).

Off and Away - Gate to Gate
Students are expected to turn their phone off and put it into their bag while at school (between 8:30 am and 3:30 pm). This includes school activities such as camps and excursions.

SWITCH OFF

Healthy Minds & Bodies
The mobile phone policy applies during breaks as well as during classes. Students are encouraged to connect with each other and engage in physical activities during their breaks.

Making Good Choices
Consequences will apply if students choose not to follow the mobile phone and smart devices policy. This can include temporary confiscation of the device.

Kandos High School Mobile Phone Policy & Procedure

PROCEDURE FOR MISUSE OF MOBILE PHONES ON SCHOOL GROUNDS

Level 0

Mobile phone is switched off and stored in school bag. No consequences.

Level 1

Mobile phone is seen and/or in use during school hours - 1st incident.

In Class

Teacher sends student to Front Office to hand in phone. A notification is sent to parents/carers via SMS, once phone is handed in. An Off and Away slip is given to the student to take back to the teacher. Teacher puts a negative entry on Sentral.

Out of Class on Grounds

Teacher on duty notifies Head Teacher on duty. Head Teacher accompanies student to Front Office to hand in phone. A notification is sent to parents/carers via SMS, once phone is handed in. Head Teacher puts a negative entry on Sentral.

Student will be interviewed by Deputy Principal.

Level 2

Mobile phone is seen and/or in use during school hours - 2nd incident. Same procedure as Level 1 followed by interview with Principal and formal caution of suspension. Parents/carers formally notified.

Level 3

Mobile phone is seen and/or in use during school hours - 3rd incident. Same procedure as Level 1 followed by interview with Principal and suspension. Parents/carers formally notified.

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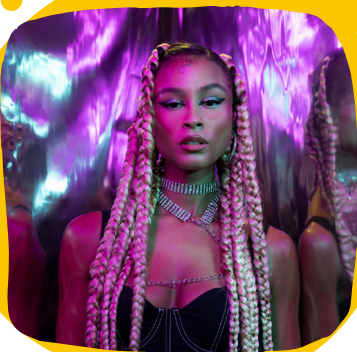

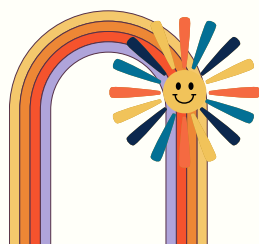

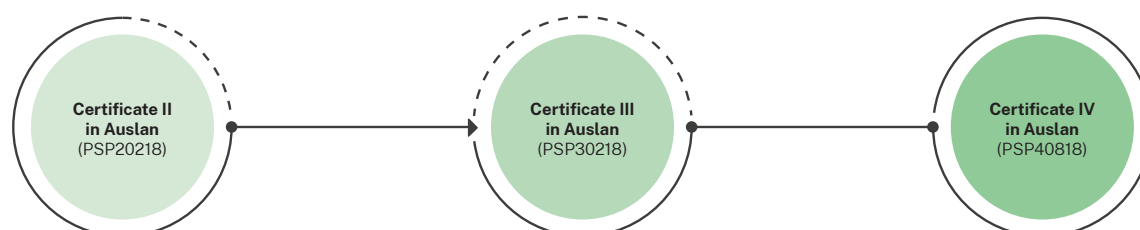
Auslan

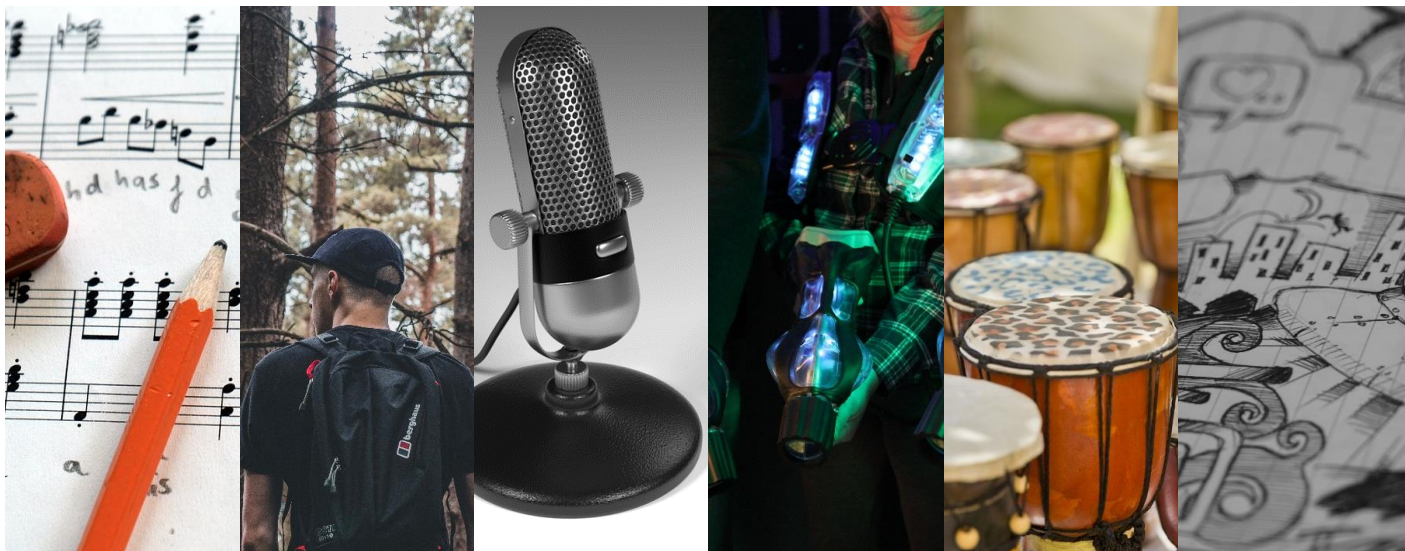
Example of possible course pathways

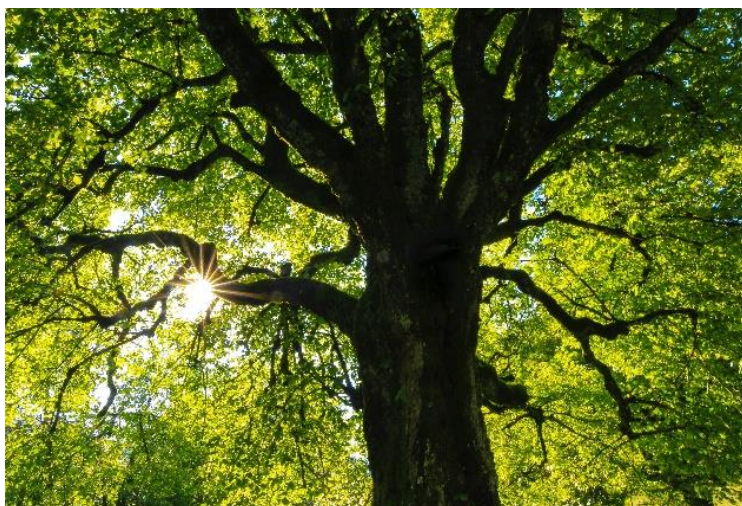

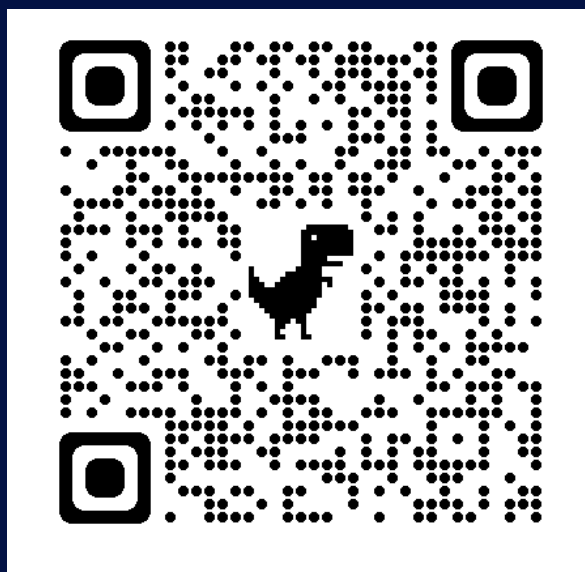
