Tips for Good Hygiene



Due to the health risks to people with chronic lung conditions, aerosol deodorants are banned from all public schools in NSW. There are many alternatives to aerosol deodorants and ways to support your child with their hygiene. Here are a few helpful tips:

- Stay Hydrated: Drinking plenty of water helps regulate body temperature and can reduce the intensity of body odour. Encourage them to drink water throughout the day.





Summer School Uniforms

Now is the perfect time to invest in suitable summer uniforms! As the temperatures rise, it's important for all students to dress appropriately and in line with our school values.

Please remember that the following items are not permitted as part of the school uniform:

- Clothing that ends higher than halfway up the thigh
- Footless tights or leggings (unless worn with a navy skirt)
- · Bike pants or activewear
- Clothes with bright colours, patterns, or logos/insignias that don't match our uniform requirements

On mufti days, we ask that students adhere to these same standards. Clothing that doesn't meet these guidelines, including activewear and inappropriate lengths, is not allowed. If students are not participating in mufti days, they must wear the full school uniform.

Creating Links to Industry Program (CLIP) Applications Now Open

Kandos High School is excited to announce that the Creating Links to Industry Program (CLIP) is entering its 7th year in 2025! This program is designed for Year 9 and Year 10 students looking to develop essential employability skills, with an impressive success rate, 94% of students who complete the full program go on to gain full-time employment or continue their studies for the HSC.

Who is CLIP for?

CLIP is perfect for students planning to seek employment after Year 10 or Year 11, while still providing the flexibility to complete the HSC if they choose. The curriculum focuses heavily on work-related literacy and numeracy, along with important workplace excursions to enhance learning.

Program Expectations

Students in the CLIP program must meet specific expectations, including upholding school rules, participating in all excursions, and working cooperatively. They'll also set personal and learning goals to work towards each year.

How to Apply for 2025:

- Submit the application form to the school office by Tuesday, 1st November 2024.
- Attend a suitability interview with the CLIP Coordinator and a parent.
- Sign a contract outlining your goals and commitment to the program.

PCYC Safer Driver Course at KHS

The Safer Drivers Course equips learner drivers with essential knowledge to reduce road risks and prevent accidents, helping them become safer drivers. As an accredited provider of the Transport for NSW Safer Drivers Course, PCYC NSW ensures that participants leave with a deeper understanding of how to drive safely as a P-plate driver.

Statistically, the first six months after obtaining a provisional licence are the most dangerous. During this period, new P-plate drivers often find it challenging to navigate the roads without an experienced instructor's support. Our course provides young drivers with the tools to manage this transition successfully.

PCYC NSW is the largest provider of driver education programs in New South Wales, offering the course across the state through our network of over 60 clubs.

Module 1

This 3-hour group session, led by a facilitator, focuses on on-road decision-making, hazard identification, the consequences of actions, peer influence, and external pressures. The group discussion is designed to be interactive, encouraging feedback and the exchange of ideas in a positive learning environment.

Module 2

In this 2-hour on-road coaching session, two learner drivers share the car with a professional coach. The session puts the lessons from Module 1 into practice, helping young drivers recognise and manage risks while reducing unsafe behaviours. These practical sessions are delivered by certified instructors from the NSW Driver Trainers Association and focus on developing effective strategies and behaviours to ensure safer driving.

Safer Drivers Course Requirements

- Hold a valid NSW Learner's Permit
- Be under 25 years old
- Have completed a minimum of 50 hours of actual on-road driving (hours under the Structured Professional Lesson (3-for-1) scheme are excluded).

Self-Select students will also be expected to participate in extra-curricular activities and support a positive classroom environment. Performance will be reviewed regularly, and students not meeting expectations may be withdrawn.



our educators bring to Kandos High School every day.


Here are just a few of the wonderful comments we've gathered:

KHS Shines at Interschool Horse Extravaganza Tamworth

The KHS Equestrian Team recently participated in the Interschool Horse Extravaganza (ISHE) in Tamworth, delivering an impressive display of dedication, skill, and sportsmanship. Over several days, our riders represented KHS with resilience and enthusiasm across a variety of events.



Day One: One Day Event (ODE)

Our team's journey began with Ella Trudgett and her horse Cisco competing in the ODE65, a multifaceted competition that tests a horse and rider's abilities across three demanding phases: dressage, showjumping, and cross-country. Despite facing challenges, including a last-minute change in the dressage test and the onset of an unexpected storm, Ella and Cisco showcased outstanding adaptability and spirit. Though they were pulled up just before the finish line in cross-country, both passed the vet check, ending the day with personal wins and a wealth of experience. Ella's positivity and resilience were truly commendable.





Day Two: Showjumping

Ella and Cisco started the day with the 90cm showjumping event. After a long and tiring day on the course, Cisco faced a hurdle with a refusal at the second jump. However, Ella demonstrated excellent horsemanship. finding silver linings in the experience, and patting Cisco for his efforts. This served as a reminder of the physical and mental demands of equestrian sports. Day Two: Junior Working Horse Challenge

Later, our second team member, Riley Flanagan, joined the action, making a remarkable debut in the junior Working Horse Challenge with his mare, Bandit (Smooth Talkin Player). The competition, which included a Hack Pattern, Working Pattern, and Time Trial, tested both the horse and rider's versatility and control. Competing against approximately 45 riders, Riley excelled, achieving 2nd place in the Hack and finishing 5th overall—an impressive accomplishment for his first interschool competition!







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Day Three: Campdrafting and Mounted Games

On the final day, Riley showcased his skills in campdrafting, a popular Australian sport where the rider maneuvers cattle through a course. This event required precision and strong communication between Riley and Bandit. In addition, Riley participated in various mounted games, including the Flag Race, Bending Race, Western Pole Bend, Running T, and Barrels, some of which he tried for the first time. Riley's versatility and determination were apparent as he successfully tackled each challenge, gaining new skills and confidence along the way.

The KHS Equestrian Team riders represented our school with pride, resilience, and exceptional sportsmanship. Congratulations to Ella and Riley for their achievements and for making KHS proud. 


New House Flags - Flag Comp Winners

What is the School Student Broadband Initiative?

To boost education opportunities and narrow the digital divide, the Australian Government is providing up to 30,000 eligible families with school age children with no internet at home access to free **nbn**® until 31 December 2025¹ under the School Student Broadband Initiative (SSBI)

Access to the SSBI will become easier, with the announcement of a National Referral Centre that parents/carers with school students can contact directly to check their eligibility.

Who is eligible for the SSBI?

It is important to note the SSBI is primarily intended as an affordability measure to help those with school-age children.

To be eligible for SSBI, families working directly with an SSBI Nominating Organisation, or self-nominating through the National Referral Centre, must:

- Have a child living at home that is enrolled in an Australian school (up to year 12 including from Prep in Qld/Vic/Tas, Kindy in NSW, Reception in SA, Transition in NT/ACT and Pre-Primary in WA).
- Not have an active nbn® network internet service at home. Having a mobile internet service does not affect eligibility.
- Live in a premises that can access a standard² nbn service.
- Not have had an active **nbn** connection during the previous 14 days.
- Either be referred by a nominating organisation or have your suitability determined via an assessment conducted by the National Referral Centre.

How can I check my eligibility?

To check your eligibility, follow these simple steps.

- Contact the National Referral Centre on 1800 954 610 (Mon-Fri, 10am-6pm AEDT), or <u>www.anglicarevic.org.au/student-internet</u>. Callback and webchat functions are also available via the website.³
- 2. Check your eligibility the NRC team will assess your eligibility, by checking your residential address and asking you some questions to determine if you meet the Government's eligibility criteria.
- If eligible, you will be issued a voucher which can be redeemed at any of the participating SSBI retail service providers. The National Referral Centre will also be available to assist with contacting your SSBI internet service provider of choice or providing follow-up support.

¹ This is subject to continued involvement in SSBI of participating internet providers beyond the previously announced deadlines, and provided the cap of 30,000 SSBI services has not yet be reached.

² A standard nbn service refers to a <u>standard</u> installation of nbn supplied equipment. This includes connecting a fibre optic cable from your street to the nbn utility box outside your premises, then inside to the nbn connection. nbn does not charge end customers for a standard installation. Remember to ask your chosen SSBI participating internet provider if they have any other fees. A small number of premises located in Limited Access Areas (any area within the footprint of the Satellite Network that cannot reasonably be accessed by road and would require some element of air or water transportation) are ineligible to access the SSBI.

³ The National Referral Centre is operated by Anglicare Victoria and is open to eligible Australian parents/carers.

In the Classroom - Science

Year 10 students engaged in hands-on learning with titrations in their science class. They explored the process of measuring the concentration of a solution by carefully adding a titrant to a solution of unknown concentration until the reaction reaches its endpoint.

Students demonstrated great precision and teamwork as they conducted experiments, deepening their understanding of chemical reactions and analytical techniques. It was a fantastic opportunity for them to apply theoretical knowledge in a practical setting!





Our Year 7 students had a creative and educational experience as they pressed shells into playdough to create plaster fossils. This handson activity allowed them to explore the concept of fossil formation and the importance of shells in understanding past life forms. As they crafted their fossils, students learned about the processes of moulding and casting, while also developing their fine motor skills and creativity. It was

a fun way to connect science and art, and to deepen their understanding of geology!
