

English Department Update

Our Year 12 Standard class has been learning about the poetry of Aboriginal Australian poet Oodgeroo Noonuccal. This close study has included looking at seven of her poems from her tour to China.

After weeks of working to comprehend the poems, one by one, Reed Flute Cave was one of the favourites, we had to put them all together to see the connections. Enter the String Activity. Using string, we linked poems by theme and poetic techniques. It now sits proudly on our wall serving as a tactile learning tool. Follow the string to see the connections. The students came to understand that there was a connection between when the poems were written and the themes the poet was exploring. They also came to see that two of the poems were more connected than the others to the themes. I know I am looking forward to seeing them demonstrate their understanding through short answer and practice essay questions over the next week. We have the HSC strongly in our sights!


