

Throughout the course, students worked under the guidance of skilled TAFE trainers to design and build their very own fold-away chairs using recycled timber. Along the way, they developed essential trade skills such as:

- Using traditional tools including chisels, hammers, mallets, block planes, and saws
- Reading and following detailed carpentry plans


Measuring, marking out timber, and constructing each component

KHS Chess Team Sweeps Cobar High!


Kandos High School's chess team has once again proven they're a force to be reckoned with, claiming four straight wins in their recent online match against Cobar High School!

Special thanks to Coach Miss Belinda Innes and Mr Rod San Martin, who left the match with a few more grey hairs, but also very proud hearts.
















NSW CHS Boccia Championships

On Wednesday 11 June, seven students from our Support Unit travelled to Bathurst to participate in the Western Division of the NSW CHS Boccia Championships.

Boccia is a relatively new school sport designed to be inclusive of all students, particularly those with physical disabilities. Players can throw, kick, or use a head pointer with a ramp to try and get their balls closest to the 'Jack' (a white ball). Much like lawn bowls, the team with the balls closest to the Jack scores the points for that round.

Our team competed in five round games and, by the end of Round 4, were sitting equal on points with Forbes and Henry Lawson High School. We faced Henry Lawson in the final round, with the winner progressing to the grand final and the loser heading into the fifth-place playoff. After a tightly contested match, we finished 3–3 at the end of regular play, resulting in a bonus round to break the tie. Unfortunately, Henry Lawson secured the bonus point, but we bounced back strongly to win the fifth-place playoff against Holman Place School.

NAPLAN Results

A reminder for families that NAPLAN results will be released in Term 3. We'll notify you as soon as the individual student reports arrive at the school and are ready to be distributed.

What is NAPLAN?

NAPLAN (National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy) is a nationwide test for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9, assessing skills in reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation), and numeracy.

When is it taken?

NAPLAN is held annually in Term 1 (around March), and results are released later in the year.

Why is it important?

NAPLAN gives schools and families insight into how students are progressing with foundational skills. It helps inform teaching and identify areas where students might benefit from additional support.

It's not a pass or fail test, it's about progress and identifying strengths and growth areas. Student reports are individual. You'll receive a personal report that shows how your child performed in each area, with a comparison to the national average.






